We, the undersigned organizations, businesses and individuals affirm our support for the closure of Boat Harbour Effluent Treatment Facility in Pictou Landing, Nova Scotia, on January 31, 2020.

We say YES - The Boat Harbour Act must be honoured. Boat Harbour Effluent Treatment Facility must close on January 31, 2020, as promised, and as passed into law in May, 2015.

We say ABSOLUTELY NO to Northern Pulp’s appeal for more time to build a new effluent treatment facility, which would require breaching the Boat Harbour Act. Northern Pulp was given 5 years. That is long enough.

We say NO to any extension of what is now recognized as one of the worst cases of environmental racism in Nova Scotia, possibly in Canada.

There can be no more broken promises to the community of Pictou Landing First Nation, which has lived with and suffered from the devastation caused by pulp effluent in Boat Harbour for more than 50 years.

We, the undersigned, endorse this statement and pledge our support. Pictou Landing First Nation, you do not stand alone.
